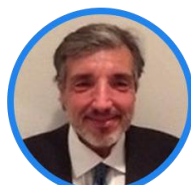

The SPGG and IAGG have made a public appeal for the urgent need to create conditions in our societies that limit loneliness and social isolation, through measures that promote increased social connections.

Social loneliness is an epidemic with significant health risks, including increasing the occurrence of various mental and physical health problems, such as anxiety, depression, dementia, stroke and heart disease.

NEW IAGG MEMBER: THE MOROCCAN NATIONAL SOCIETY OF GERIATRICS AND GERONTOLOGY **WELCOME!**



The Moroccan National Society of Geriatrics and Gerontology (SNMGG) was founded in 2022 in Rabat to promote equitable healthcare for all social groups and address the challenges of Morocco's new development model. Its main goals include standardizing elderly care, promoting continuous medical training, and collaborating with institutions to support healthy aging. Professor Mouna Maamar, Head of the Geriatrics Unit at CHU Ibn Sina and director of geriatrics training programs in Rabat, leads the SNMGG. People over 60 now represent around 12% of Morocco's population, with life expectancy exceeding 75 years. This group often faces chronic diseases such as cardiovascular, respiratory, neurological conditions, diabetes, rheumatism, and Alzheimer's. Geriatrics, with its multidisciplinary approach, can improve their quality of life. However, Morocco currently lacks enough geriatric specialists to meet nationwide needs.

Message from the Regional Chair

Dear IAGG Asia/Oceania Council Members,

As the year 2024 concludes, I am pleased to share the progress and activities that have strengthened our mission to enhance geriatric care and research in the Asia-Oceania region.

Throughout last year, we witnessed significant collaborations and events that have fortified our network and advanced our shared goals. In January 2024, we were honored to witness the induction ceremony of the Philippine Society of Geriatrics and Gerontology (PSGG) officers and board members for the 2024-2026 term. This event marked a new chapter in our shared journey to serve older adults in the Philippines.



In August, we supported the PSGG annual convention, where our Secretary-General, Prof. Ding-Cheng Chan, delivered the keynote speech. This engagement further solidified our partnerships within the region and emphasized our dedication to supporting the professional development of geriatricians and gerontologists. Furthermore, in October, we successfully held a webinar titled "Age-Friendly Cities and Communities" moderated by Prof. Julie Byles, with expert speakers sharing their insights. This event underscored our commitment to fostering inclusive environments for older adults and promoting age-friendly initiatives across the region. Our collaboration with the Asia Pacific Geriatrics Network (APGN) in November, with Prof. Meng-Chih Lee as a key organizer, broadened our reach and strengthened relationships with other geriatrics experts in Asia-Pacific.



In March, we co-hosted the International Conference on Sarcopenic Obesity 2024 in Taiwan, bringing together experts from ten countries to address the epidemiology, diagnosis, and prevention of sarcopenic obesity. This conference provided a valuable platform for knowledge exchange and collaboration among researchers and clinicians dedicated to improving the health of older adults.

Additionally, the IAGG regional chairs from Asia and Oceania convened in March to discuss key topics for the 2026 IAGG Conference in Amsterdam. The discussions focused on scholarships, diversity in themes, and strengthened communication between regional and global bodies. These efforts highlight our commitment to fostering inclusivity and collaboration within the IAGG network.

In November, we also actively participated in the International Conference for Healthy Aging and Nutrition hosted by the Taiwan National Health Research Institutes. Key members presented, moderated sessions, and engaged in discussions, demonstrating IAGG-AOR's commitment to regional collaboration and knowledge sharing in the field of aging. In addition, the Executive Committee held meetings in July and December to discuss and plan our activities and initiatives. These meetings provided a valuable opportunity for us to collaborate and ensure that we are effectively addressing the needs of our members and the wider community.

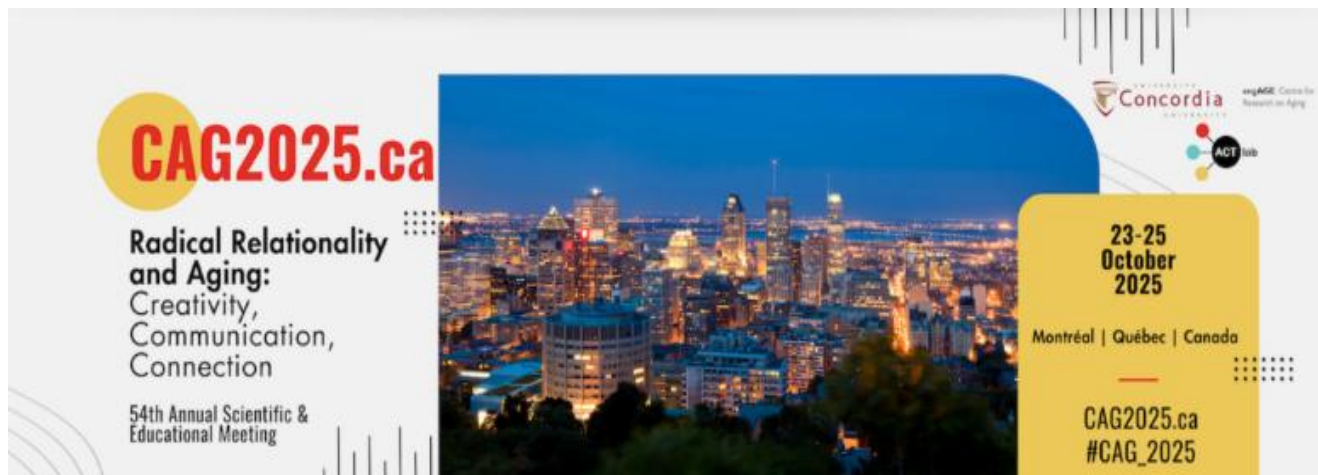

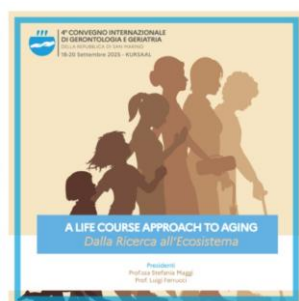

GLOBAL SOCIAL ISSUES ON AGING (GSIA)

Global Social Initiative on Aging (GSIA) concerned by fostering collaborative, trans-national approaches to the creation and transfer of knowledge at the intersections of global trends and population ageing.

The GSIA will address critical challenges arising from these global trends including:

The sustainability of older rural populations who face increased poverty and out-migration of young people arising from the impact of climate change.

The ability of families to sustain intergenerational support in the face of poverty, pandemics, and changing family structures and beliefs.

Global shifts in world economies toward the individualization of risk that have led to increasing income disparities, older adults who are left behind in migratory transitions, and widening north-south divides.

The erosion or absence of social welfare provisions that have resulted in increasing social and economic costs of care.

IAGG IN UNITED NATIONS:

MISSION AND OBJECTIVES



In 2009, IAGG was established with the ECOSOC special Consultative Status allowing IAGG to make oral and written statements. IAGG has been a member of the Conference of Non-Governmental Organizations (CONGO) in Consultative Relationship with the UN since 1985.

Established in 2010, the UN Open-ended Working Group on Ageing (OEWGA) spent 14 years reviewing human rights protections for older persons, identifying

gaps, and proposing solutions.

IAGG actively contributed through statements, side events, and advocacy for stronger legal protections. In May 2024, OEWGA finalized a document outlining these gaps and presenting options for action.

Among the proposed solutions is a legally binding Convention, supported by IAGG and the Global Alliance for the Rights of Older People (GAROP). Other options suggest updates to existing policies.

A consensus was reached to submit the final document to the UN General Assembly, aiming for further action by the Human Rights Council in Geneva.





Historic Resolution Advances Human Rights of Older Persons



UN to Draft New Convention on the Rights of Older Persons:

On April 3, 2025, the UN Human Rights Council adopted a historic resolution to establish an intergovernmental working group that will draft a legally binding international convention on the rights of older persons.

This follows 14 years of work by the Open-Ended Working Group on Ageing, which revealed major gaps in the protection of older persons' rights. The resolution, led by Argentina, Brazil, The Gambia, the Philippines, and Slovenia, was backed by 68 countries.

NGOs played a vital role in advocacy efforts, with groups like HelpAge, AARP, and the Global Alliance for the Rights of Older Persons actively involved.

This landmark step begins a global process to enshrine older persons' rights in international law, with

WHO Guideline on chronic primary low back pain in adults:

Dr. Miguel Acanfora, IAGG Vice President and Secretary, has participated in Guideline Development Group (GDG) virtual meeting in September 2022. Low back pain (LBP) describes pain between the lower edge of the ribs and the buttock. It can last for a short time (acute), a little longer (sub-acute) or a long time (chronic). It can affect anyone. LBP makes it hard to move and can affect quality of life and mental well-being. It can limit work activities and engagement with family and friends.

LBP can be specific or non-specific. Specific LBP is pain that is caused by a certain disease or structural problem in the spine, or when the pain radiates from another part of the body.

Non-specific LBP is when it isn't possible to identify a specific disease or structural reason to explain the pain. LBP is non-specific in about 90% of cases.

In all types and at all stages of LBP, rehabilitation is essential to reassure people and help them make sense of their pain, help them return to activities they enjoy and identify strategies to support recovery and improve function. Specialized care pathways may be needed for specific LBP.

An estimated 619 million people live with LBP and it is the leading cause of disability worldwide. LBP is a major public health issue. LBP is often associated with loss of work productivity and thus produces huge economic burden on individuals and on societies.

WHO Clinical Consortium on Healthy Ageing 2023 (CCHA 2023) + Global Network on Long Term care (GNLTC)

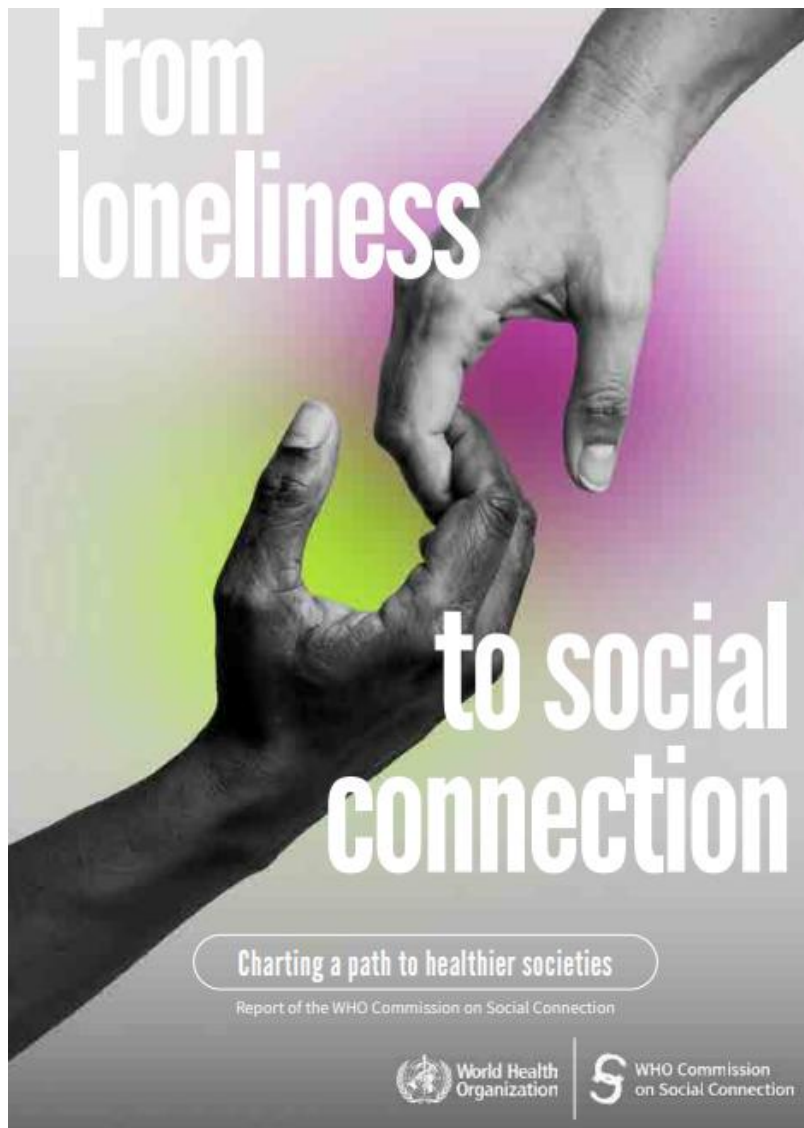
